

Quilter's Guild gives comfort quilts to APD

The Gulf Coast Quilter's Guild was honored by Mayor Gary Appelt during the city council meeting Jan. 18. Eva Broz, President of the Guild, and Jean Hatch, Community Service Chairperson, received the Certificate of Appreciation on behalf of the Guild.

For a community service project, the Quilter's Guild makes a number of small quilts by hand and donates them to area police departments to give to children in domestic violence situations. Broz said they have made 75 quilts this year for the project, and those quilts have been distributed between the League City, Alvin, and Pearland police departments.
